Campout!

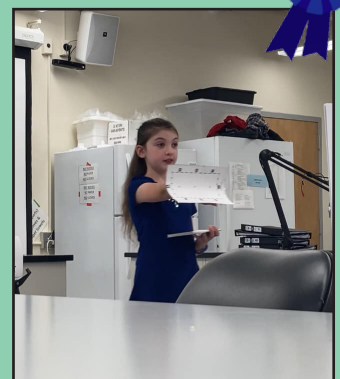

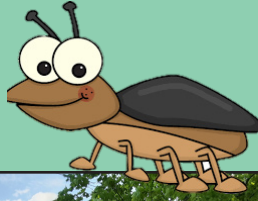

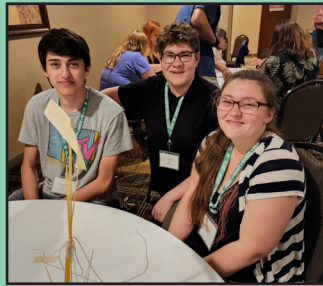
OUTDOOR COOKING (ages 12+)(2nd Sat. / month)

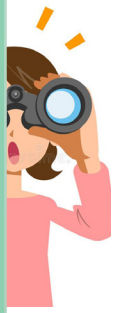


STATE DAIRY BOWL COMPETITION
