Club Spotlights

Groovy Goat Getters

We are the Groovy Goat Getters, a new club started this spring focusing on dairy goats! We have a wide range of ages, from Cloverbuds up to senior 4-H'ers. As a club, the Groovy Goat Getters will be learning about the different aspects of dairy goat care, showing, and recipes and projects using the milk. Some of the aspects to be covered include nutrition, first aid, medications, clipping, and conformation. The club plans to be doing a showmanship clinic to help their members grow as showmen. Through the summer, many of our members will be showing their goats at various shows around New York State, including the Chenango County Fair and New York State Fair.

Recently we were able to learn about dairy products and participated in a butter making demonstration. Each of us was able to make butter using cream, a mason jar, and a whole lot of arm power. We have a variety of club members, we work together to learn and encourage each other. We have members that come from agricultural backgrounds and we have some members who don't. We participate in activities that for some of us is everyday life and for others it is a brand new adventure. We plan activities around feeding our minds and our creative side while developing life skills.

Shooting Sports Beginner Course - This June/July!

Chenango County 4-H Shooting Sports will run a six week introduction to archery and air rifle. This program, taught by our trained instructors, is designed for youth new to shooting sports and will concentrate on safety and technique. For ages 9 and up. Must be enrolled 4-H members. We will have three 1.5 hour long sessions of archery on June 12, 19, 26 and three 1.5 hour long sessions of air rifle on July 10, 17, 24 beginning at 5:30pm. The course is free and all materials will be provided. The program will be held at the Rockdale Rod and Gun Club, 312 Rockdale Road, Mt. Upton, NY.

Youth will prepare a chosen recipe, using a garden item they grew, at the Farm to Fork Event during the County Fair.


This Issue's Friend of 4-H: Leader's/Volunteer Association
