### **REFLECTIONS OF 2021!**

Heading into a new year gives us an opportunity for a bit of reflection. Chenango County Cooperative Extension kept up with the oncoming challenges as Covid continued to linger. Everyone tried to maintain close to normal programming as they could.

SNAP-Ed educators worked tirelessly to come up with new delivery methods for curriculums, innovative on- line video demonstrations, tips & tricks for produce (available on SNAP-Ed.org), taught on line classes, and the development of a seasonal newsletters. In the spring, educator Neisa was able to get back into the Schools to teach in person programming.

Grow Cook Serve; a United Way funded program, joined forces with 4-H and SNAP-ED nutrition educators to create Kids in the Kitchen. A virtual program, Kids in the Kitchen, equips 4-H participants to prepare simple, healthy meals, for their families. Once a month families receive ingredients and recipes and cook along, via zoom, with a nutrition educator to create dinner at home.

As 2021 continued, a new program emerged with the help of a Chobani grant. With this grant, the Regional Beef and Sheep Farming Initiative came about. Rich Taber has been working to improve this area of agriculture, educating folks on the many nuances of raising beef and sheep. In October, a clinic for veterans took place, on the topics of grazing management. You can read more about this workshop in his article on page 4. Rich will continue to work with beef and sheep programs into the New Year.

Another CCE program that remained steadfast throughout 2021 was 4-H. The educators pushed ahead offering zoom craft and cooking sessions, on line arts and craft how to's were posted. This gathered guite a following on our Facebook page. As the year began to open up things started to get back into full swing with in person activities. Outdoor adventure offered many different types of outdoor experiences: snowshoeing, hiking, fire building, ice fishing, kayaking, and many more skill building activities. Meetings for Dairy bowl, Horsebowl, and Hippology as well as regional knowledge competitions in these areas were able to take place. 4-Hers' were being offered other opportunities as well like shooting sports, Public presentations, sewing camp, craft camps, and afterschool activities. That is not all that 4-H had to offer, a new educator Craig, came on board joining the team. With that came Ag Literacy week, not able to go into the schools Craig was able to zoom into the classrooms providing several a look at how ice cream is made. During spring and summer, 4-H'ers were happy to be able to participate in Survival Skills, the Junior Livestock Show, Chenango County fair, and some went on to Afton Fair. Afterschool programs began to open up and 4-H'ers were able to meet in person with their clubs.

Keep following along as CCE continues to offer more programming to our community.

### INGREDIENTS:

1 large butternut squash

Serving size: 1/2 cup

2 tbsp butter

Serves 8

- 3 tbsp brown sugar
- 1/2 tbsp pumpkin pie spice

#### Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375. Place foil on baking sheet.
- 2. Rinse squash with cold water, dry and then cut in half length wise. Remove seeds.
- 3. Melt butter, add brown sugar and spice.
- 4. Spread mixture evenly over squash and bake about 45 minutes, or until tender.



### Fall in! Veterans Let's Go Grazing!

### Rich Taber, CCE Chenango



It was a beautiful, sunny early October 1, day that greeted twenty attendees, mostly Veterans, who came from all over the state, and journeyed to Rich Taber's farm, Great Northern Farm, in nearby Madison County. Rich and his wife Wendy were the hosts of a Veterans Grazing Workshop, co-sponsored by the Cornell Small Farms Veterans Outreach program, the Chobani Foundation, and CCE Chenango. The purpose of the program was to instruct the attendees about how to set up a grazing system for a variety of livestock on their home farms. In the morning, participants were provided a presentation by Rich Taber, who is the Grazing, Forestry, and Livestock Specialist for CCE Chenango. Topics covered were designing perimeter fences, installing interior temporary paddock fences, electric fencing systems, establishing, reclaiming and maintaining grass swards, along with some of the machinery needed to do all of this with. After a catered luncheon, a tour of the farm was held during which Rich explained his applications of the theories that were presented in the morning. The farm is home to about 36 head of beef cattle and 16 head of stocker dairy heifers; each herd managed separately. Each participant was provided with a copy of Sarsh Flak's book, "The Art and Science of Grazing", a flagship book used throughout the grazing industry. Rich can be reached at rbt44@cornell.edu.


