4-H Public Presentations & Horse Communications Public Speaking: It's for You!

The Public Presentation Program is one of 4-H's most beneficial and rewarding experiences. It is the one most often credited by 4-H alumni as having given them an edge above peers in both college and professional careers. It provides a unique opportunity to develop a positive self-concept and poise, gain self-confidence before a group, learn to express ideas clearly, respond spontaneously to questions, and gain subject matter knowledge. Through a progressive series of communication activities, youth learn to express themselves and their ideas.

GENERAL TOPIC:

Demonstration: This type of presentation requires you to talk while working on something. It can be cooking, sewing, building, etc.

Illustrated Talk: This is slightly more formal, using a poster or technology to help you relay your message. **Speech:** This is for the more experienced speaker, you do not use posters or technology to get your point across.

Dramatization/Recitation: A fun, confidence building experience -- it is like acting only with out props. **EQUINE:**

Speech: Subject must pertain to the horse industry, or be horse-related, and be original and factual. Visual aids of any kind are not allowed (posters, items, equipment, etc.).

Individual presentation: Subject must pertain to the horse industry, or be horse related, and be original and factual. The presentation may be a demonstration or illustrated talk.

Team presentation: Subject must pertain to the horse industry, or be horse related, and be original and factual. The presentation may be a demonstration or illustrated talk and requires two 4-H'ers presenting content equally.


